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The *South West Wales Regional Contractors Framework 2020* launched on 1st February and has had a busy first 6 months despite the COVID-19 situation and challenges it has brought to the construction industry.

- Seamless transition from SWWRCF2015 to SWWRCF2020
- Currently 35 Projects worth an estimated
 £218million currently due on the SWWRCF pipeline
- 6 Projects awarded on direct award basis
- Future opportunities of approximately £302million recorded on SWWRCF database to date
- Combined total of approx. £934 million committed to current and previous iteration of SWWRCF as of August 2020
- Provides diverse opportunities with an array of projects, with first NHS scheme currently being tendered via the framework
- To date there have been 12 Project Bank Accounts established and executed across the region for projects tendered under SWWRCF
